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## Building Department

Winter Seasonal Reminders –From the Office of the Construction Official

- As we enter the winter months, the Bergenfield Building Department would like to provide residents with important safety reminders, permit guidance, and seasonal tips to help protect your home and keep our community safe. Winter weather creates unique challenges, and a little preparation now can prevent costly issues later.
- Be sure to have your boiler or furnace serviced by a qualified professional. Residents should also be aware that permits are required for the replacement of hot water or steam boilers, hot air furnace replacements, chimney liners, and any oil-to-gas boiler or furnace conversions. Proper maintenance and code compliance help ensure a safe and comfortable heating season.
- Test all smoke, carbon monoxide, or combination detectors throughout your home and replace batteries if needed. Never use gas ovens or portable heaters to warm your home, as these practices create serious fire and carbon monoxide hazards. Keep all boiler and furnace rooms free from debris, storage, and clutter so equipment can operate safely.
- Heavy, wet snow can place significant stress on roofing systems, particularly flat roofs. Be alert for sagging ceilings, doors that suddenly begin to stick, or unusual creaking and popping sounds, as these may indicate structural stress. If any of these signs appear, evacuate the area and contact a qualified professional for evaluation.
- If you lose power, never operate a generator indoors, inside a garage, or near any open window. Generators should be placed a minimum of ten feet from your home to reduce the risk of carbon monoxide entering the building. Always use generators according to manufacturer instructions and ensure your carbon monoxide detectors are working properly.
- Before a winter storm, check your sump pump to confirm proper operation and make sure gutters and downspouts are clear so water can drain away from your home. Turn off the interior valves feeding your outdoor hose bibs and leave the bibs open to prevent freezing. Taking these simple precautions can greatly reduce the chance of burst pipes and water damage.
- Every household should know the location of its main water shutoff valve. In the event of a pipe freeze or burst line, being able to quickly shut off the water can prevent extensive property damage.

Dear Bergenfield Resident,

### Annual Landlord Registration Reminder

This is a reminder that the Annual Landlord Registration period is approaching. If you own a two-family dwelling or a non-owner-occupied single-family dwelling, you are required by law to register your property with the Borough of Bergenfield and schedule an inspection of the rental unit.

Registration must be completed by February 15, 2026, and all inspections must be completed by June 1, 2026.

Please complete the application, submit your payment, and contact Code Enforcement immediately to schedule your inspection, as time slots fill up quickly.

The annual fee is \$50.00 per rental unit, with waivers available for qualifying Senior Citizens and Veterans. Registration forms are available online, at Borough Hall, or by calling (201) 387-4055 ext. 4151.

Please remember: No rental rooms are allowed in the Borough of Bergenfield. Use of Air B&B or VRBO is prohibited.

If you suspect a violation, contact the Code Enforcement Bureau. All reports are confidential.

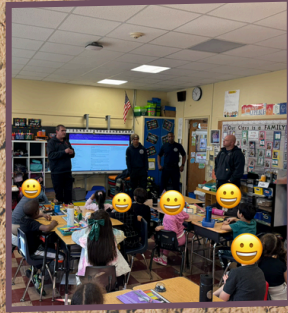

The Bergenfield Fire Department encourages all residents to take a few simple precautions to stay safe this winter:

- Keep heating equipment clean and inspected, including furnaces, fireplaces, and chimneys.
- Use space heaters responsibly—place them on flat surfaces and keep at least three feet of clearance around them.
- Never leave candles unattended, and consider using flameless alternatives.
- Test smoke and carbon monoxide alarms and replace batteries if needed.
- Store fireplace ash in metal containers and keep them away from the home.
- Your vigilance helps protect your household and our community. Stay fire-safe this winter

The Bergenfield Volunteer Ambulance Corps reminds residents to take steps to stay healthy and prepared during the colder months:

- Dress in layers and limit time outdoors during extreme cold to avoid frostbite and hypothermia.
- Watch for signs of cold-related illness, especially among children, seniors, and those with medical conditions.
- Use extra caution when walking on snow or ice to prevent slips and injuries.
- Keep emergency information handy, including medications, allergies, and contact numbers.
- Ensure your home's driveways and steps are clear so first responders can safely reach you in an emergency.
- Taking simple precautions helps us respond quickly and keeps our community safe throughout the winter season.

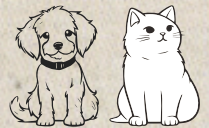


## NEWS FROM THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

*In New Jersey, it's mandatory that dog & cat owners have their pets licensed. A license tag helps police, animal control and shelters quickly identify your dog or cat and get them back to you safely. Licensing your pet is important to control the spread of Rabies, it also ensures when a dog bite occurs and person is bitten, the town can quickly identify and immediately determine whether the animal is up to date on its Rabies vaccine. Fees from pet licensing are distributed to the statewide Animal population control program.*



**All Dogs/Cats MUST be licensed by January 31, 2026. Please scan QR code on the left to access the online application. Please mail application with a copy of updated rabies vaccine & payment. Rabies vaccine MUST be valid through the entire licensing period.**

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## Bergenfield Assists Seniors and Residents with Property Tax Relief Programs

Back in October, the Mayor and Council—together with the Borough’s Tax Department—were proud to support our senior community by offering hands-on assistance with several important property tax relief programs, including StayNJ, the Senior Freeze, and the ANCHOR Program. These statewide initiatives are designed to help eligible homeowners reduce their property tax burden, and Bergenfield was committed to making sure our residents had the guidance they needed to apply successfully.



More than 150 seniors and other residents attended, receiving personalized help with applications, answers to program-specific questions, and translations of the ANCHOR Program for Spanish-speaking residents. Borough staff and volunteers worked one-on-one with attendees to make the process as smooth as possible.

A special thank-you goes to Councilman Domingo Almonte and Bergenfield Tax Collector Juan Ortiz, who led an informative and engaging presentation. Their expertise, patience, and dedication ensured the event was a tremendous success. The Borough also extends a sincere thank-you to St. John the Evangelist Church for graciously hosting the event. Their hospitality provided a welcoming and accessible space for our residents to receive essential assistance.



While many of these programs specifically support seniors, the information session benefited residents of all ages. The ANCHOR program, in particular, offers relief to a broad group of homeowners and renters, making this event an important resource for the entire community. By helping residents understand and access these programs, the Borough continues its commitment to promoting financial stability and ensuring every Bergenfield resident can take advantage of available state benefits.

## Tax Department

(ANCHOR)Program



- 1.) Delinquent notices are mailed out through out after the end of the grace period.
- 2.) PD5's (Annual Post-Tax Year Annual Statement) Must be mailed out by February 1st and returned by March 1st
- 3.) Qualified veterans, senior citizen, disabled or surviving spouse, Civil union/Domestic Partner of a senior citizen or disabled person qualified for a \$250.00 deduction on their yearly property taxes.
- 4.) Senior Citizen (65) or older may apply for the Senior freeze property tax reimbursement, Anchor Program and Stay new Jersey by going to this website: [www.propertytaxrelief.nj.gov](http://www.propertytaxrelief.nj.gov) or you may call 1-800-882-6597 Starting March 1, 2026
- 5.) You may apply for the Affordable New Jersey Communities for Homeowners and Renters (ANCHOR) Program at [nj.gov/treasury/taxation/anchor/index.shtml](http://nj.gov/treasury/taxation/anchor/index.shtml)
- 6.) For your convenience the DROP BOX is available 24/7 - 7 days a week.
- 7.) Pay your property taxes online for free plus you can register for automatic alert. By going to: [Bergenfield.gov](http://Bergenfield.gov): then go the "Online Services" page.
- 8.) Property tax exemption for 100% disabled Veterans & Qualified organizations are received throughout year by the tax assessor and process for approval and/or if refund warranted by the municipal tax collector.

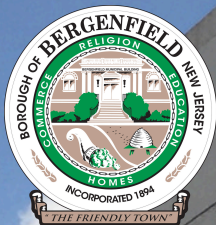

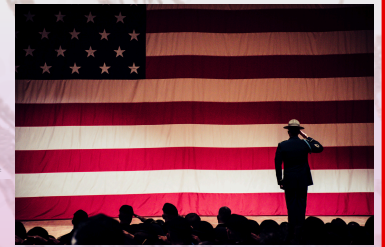
